“Is the European Union on the Verge of Collapse?”

The European Union is engulfed in its most serious crisis since World War II. The debt crisis, the Ukraine crisis, the refugee crisis, the Paris terrorist attacks, and a potential exit of the United Kingdom from the EU have tested the European project to its limits in 2015. With nothing indicating that anything will be different in 2016, many observers in Europe and the United States predict the end of Europe's revolutionary experiment in political union, with large-scale consequences for Europe and the rest of the world. The roundtable participants will provide insights into various aspects of the current crisis, and discuss how likely it is that the EU will collapse in 2016.
