## PETITION FOR NATURALIZATION

In the matter of the petition of Haiman Levin to be admitted a citizen of the United States of America.

The petition of Haiman Levin respectfully shows:

First. My full name is Haiman Levin

Second. My place of residence is number 89 Prospect street, city of Paterson State of New Jersey

Third. My occupation is Mineral Water Manufacturer

Fourth. I was born on the 7th day of October, Anno Domini 1856, at Qumen Russia

Fifth. I emigrated to the United States from Hamburg Germany on or about the 8th day of August, Anno Domini 1896, and arrived at the port of New York in the United States, on the vessel Furnessia

Sixth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States of the 14th day of October, Anno Domini 1904 at Paterson, N.J. in the Common Pleas Court of Passaic County

Seventh. I am married. My wife's name is Bessie Levin and now resides at 89 Prospect, Paterson, N.J. She was born in Rapel, Russia and has seven children.

and the name, date and place of birth and place of residence of each of said children is as follows: Leah Levin born Sept 20, 1894 at Paterson, N.J. Jacob Haiman Levin born November 19, 1880 at Qumen, Russia Nathan Levin born March 13, 1881 at Qumen, Russia Morris Levin born April 5, 1886 at Qumen, Russia Samuel Levin born September 20, 1897 at Paterson, N.J. First named child resides in Russia and has five children of his own.

Eighth. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to Nicholas II Emperor of Russia of which at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Ninth. I am able to speak the English language.

Tenth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for a term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 14th day of August, Anno Domini 1896, and in the State of New Jersey for one year at least next preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 10th day of April, Anno Domini 1897.

Eleventh. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. ~~I made a petition for citizenship to the~~ Court of ~~Paterson, N.J.~~ and the same was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit,

Attached hereto and made a part of this petition ~~is~~ my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the certificate from the Department of Commerce and Labor ~~surpassed by law~~. Wherefore your petitioner prays that he may be admitted a citizen of the United States of America.
